She then introduced the girls to Centennial High School guidance counselor and alumnae chapter member Mary Kay Carter.

Mary Kay spoke the girls about the importance of staying focused and utilizing their available resources.



Alumnae Chapter members then helped the Girl Scouts with a goals exercise that included the following questions:



What do I want to be when I grow up?

What type of education will I need to achieve my goals?

Who can help me?

Each girl presented her goals to the group then “graduated” from our program by receiving a certificate of achievement and the Kappa Delta Girl Scout patch.



We then gave the girls a head start on the upcoming school year as each participant filled a new book bag with lots of great school supplies.

The Girl Scouts and alumnae chapter participants then explored the Adventure Science Center and attended the *STARS* show at the new Sudekem Planetarium.
