The two groups have much in common. The Girl Scout organizational values of honesty, integrity and true friendship are the same values held dear by Kappa Delta. In addition, the two groups have similar goals of leadership development and community involvement.

The Nashville Kappa Delta Alumnae Chapter is proud to support the Girl Scouts of Middle Tennessee in many ways.

Each summer, we host an American Girl Anti-Bullying workshop which allows Girl Scouts to find solutions that pertain to bullying problems faced at school.

In the fall, we host several troops at our annual Dove Uniquely Me! Self-Esteem campaign. A make up artist attends this event and provides tips on enhancing natural beauty. Our alumnae chapter provides the girls with make up samples, Dove beauty supplies and the Dove Self-Esteem brochure.



In the spring, our Alumnae Chapter partners with the Vanderbilt Children's Hospital for their annual Loews Loves Kids philanthropy event. All of the Girl Scouts in attendance make gift bags and get well cards for patients of the hospital. Kappa Delta alumnae not only help coordinate the event but are also on hand to work with the Girl Scout troops in attendance.
